



Instructions Following Crown & Bridge Procedures

Congratulations on your new fixed prosthesis. This type of restoration is considered to be the most durable.

I would like to make you aware of certain recommendations regarding the necessary care and maintenance of your bridge, crown or veneer:

1. Don't eat for one hour. Don't chew on any "hard" food for the first day. It takes 24 hours for the cement to harden completely.
2. The teeth may become sensitive following cementation, but this soreness should gradually disappear. (If needed, take anti-inflammatories such as Advil or Aspirin or analgesics such as Tylenol). If the tooth remains sensitive for more than 8 weeks, consult your treating dentist.
3. If your teeth become sensitive when you bite, it may mean that the crown is too high. You should then return for a minor adjustment.
4. Be sure to maintain a proper dental hygiene. Even though the crown or veneer cannot form a cavity, the tooth supporting it still can. So keep brushing and flossing.
